





Using AI, the researchers discovered potential cancer drivers in 'junk' DNA regions, which are non-coding sections of DNA. While DNA codes for proteins, not all sequences fulfill this function. Some non-coding DNA produces RNA components, but others have unknown functions and are called junk DNA. In humans, 98% of DNA is non-coding, compared to 2% in bacteria. Evidence suggests that junk DNA may have functional roles through exaptation, acquiring functions beyond natural selection.

Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) has launched a new MA course in Bhagavadgita Studies from the 2024-2025 academic session. This information has been given in an official notification. The notification states that the master's program will be offered through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) mode from the July 2024 session, with a minimum duration of two years and a maximum of four years.
