



Most Important Points Of 03rd January in History

➤ 1831 - Savitribai Phule was born

Savitribai Phule was born on 3 January 1831. Her father's name was Khandoji Naivese and mother's name was Lakshmibai. Savitribai Phule was married to Jyotirao Phule in 1841.

Savitribai Phule was the first principal of India's first girls' school and the founder of the first farmers' school. Mahatma Jyotirao is considered one of the most important figures in the social reform movement in Maharashtra and India. He is known for his efforts to educate women and Dalit castes.



➤ 1876 – Turkey's first constitution proclaimed.

In 1876 a constitution for Turkey was drafted by the Armenian Krikor Odian, secretary to the reformer Midhat Pasha, and proclaimed and almost immediately revoked by Sultan Abdul Hamid.

The Turkish Constitution of 1921 was the fundamental law for Turkey from 1921 to 1924. It is generally accepted that the constitution was the result of the most democratic constitution-making process in Turkish history.



➤ 1894- Rabindranath Tagore inaugurated the 'Paush Mela' in Shantiniketan.

Shantiniketan is famous for Rabindranath Tagore, Visva-Bharati University and Paush Mela. Paush Mela was started in 1894 by Maharshi Devendranath Tagore to commemorate the anniversary of the Brahma Temple established in 1891 in Shantiniketan.

Paush Mela of Shantiniketan is one of the popular cultural fairs of Bengal. This fair showcases the rural heritage and folk culture of Bengal.

➤ 1909 - Albert becomes King of the Belgians.

Albert was born in Brussels as the fifth child and second son of Prince Philippe, Count of Flanders, and Princess Marie of Hohenzollern-Sigmaringen. Albert succeeded his uncle Leopold II on the Belgian throne in 1909. He married Elisabeth of Bavaria, with whom he had three children.



Albert ruled during an eventful period in Belgian history, including the duration of World War I (1914–1918), when much of Belgium was occupied by German forces.

➤ 1968- Launch of the country's first meteorological rocket 'Maneka'.

The country's first meteorological rocket 'Maneka' was launched in the year 1968.

The RH-100 was a single-stage solid-fuel rocket capable of carrying its payload to an altitude of 55 km or more. When it was combined with a 650 mm long and 40 mm wide copper shaft dart used for meteorological research, it was called the Maneka-I rocket.
