



Most Important Points Of 10th January in History

➤ 1839 – Indian tea travels to England.

The samples received favourable comments, following which an invoice for eight boxes of Assam tea was sent to London in 1838, which was auctioned on 10 January 1839. This was a momentous occasion as it not only established the price of the Assam tea plant but also determined the future direction of tea cultivation worldwide.



➤ 1910- First air flight.

Coanda-1910, the first aircraft powered by turbo-propulsor, was probably tested near Paris.

A very special day for the country's first airline Air India (then Tata Airlines) and the country's aviation industry. Air India took its first international flight, to London. There were a total of 35 passengers on board the plane.



➤ 1920- The League of Nations is founded.

The League of Nations was an organization for international cooperation. It was founded on January 10, 1920, at the initiative of the victorious Allies at the end of World War I and was formally dissolved on April 19, 1946.

The destruction caused by World War I and World War II led many people to desire an international organization dedicated to maintaining peace. This desire was so great that soon after the Paris Peace Conference was held in January 1919, the Treaty of the League of Nations was adopted.





Most Important Points Of 10th January in History

➤ **1964 - The Beatles' first album is released in the United States.**

The Beatles' first album released in the United States was... The Beatles, released on January 10, 1964.

The album was originally scheduled to be released in July 1963, but was delayed for various reasons. Chicago's Vee-Jay Records released the album ten days before Capitol's Meet the Beatles!



➤ **1996: Jordan's King's historic visit to Israel**

In 1996, Jordan's King Hussein arrived in Tel Aviv, the country's largest city, on his first public visit.

Israel and Jordan ended a 46-year-long war after a peace treaty in 1994, and King Hussein's visit to Israel was seen as a symbol of improved relations between the two countries.
