



Most Important Points Of 22th January in History

➤ **1905 - October Revolution begins in Russia.**

On Sunday, January 22, 1905, a procession of thousands of workers led by him was peaceful but was fired upon by troops in the field in front of the palace, killing hundreds of demonstrators. This incident triggered the revolution.

Leading up to the revolution, poor peasants had become increasingly agitated by the oppression of their landlords and the continuation of semi-feudal relations. Discontent was further fueled by Russia's defeat in the Russo-Japanese War and massive urban unemployment caused by the depression since 1899.



➤ **1924- Ramsay MacDonald became the first Labour Party Prime Minister of England.**

Under his leadership, the Labour Party of England came to power for the first time and he became the first Labour Prime Minister of England on January 22, 1924.

James Ramsay MacDonald was a British statesman and politician who was the first person belonging to the Labour Party to be Prime Minister of the United Kingdom, leading minority Labour governments for nine months in 1924 and again between 1929 and 1931.



➤ **1666: Mughal emperor Shah Jahan died.**

Shah Jahan died on 22 January 1666 at Musamman Burj in Agra Fort.

Shah Jahan was the fifth Mughal emperor. Shah Jahan was very popular in his time due to his sense of justice and opulence. But his name is not mentioned in history only for this reason. Shah Jahan's name is mentioned as a lover who tried to build the world's most beautiful building, Taj Mahal, for his wife Mumtaz Begum.





Most Important Points Of 22th January in History

➤ **1673: Postal service between New York and Boston begins.**

In 1673, New York Governor Francis Lovelace established a monthly postal service between New York and Boston. The service was short-lived, but the route of the postal riders became known as the Old Boston Post Road, which is part of today's US Route 1. William Penn established Pennsylvania's first post office in 1683.



The postal service system in India was established in the year 1766 and the first post office in India was established in Madras in 1786.

➤ **1963: National Library for the Blind established in Dehradun.**

Established in 1963 as National Library for the Print Handicapped (NLPH). Sections of the Library: Printing Section, Braille Section, Book Acquisition Section and Extension Library Services and Circulation Library Services.



After the independence of India, the National Library came into existence in 1948 in place of the Imperial Library by the Imperial Library (Change of Name) Act.
